### Christmas Pageant

The Christmas pageant is held each year and features floats made by Progress and community groups, bands and music. The pageant progresses down George St to Queen Square.



## Moonta Mines Uniting Church Celebrates Local Anzac Heroes

A wonderful experience of remembrance was celebrated at the Moonta Mines Uniting Church on 22 April 2018 with over 100 persons taking time to attend this memorable occasion.

An organ recital was given by Mr Daryl Parker on the 130 year old pipe organ prior to the service.

Large banners were hanging from the balcony, local people showed their generosity by sharing memorabilia of their relatives and friends who fought in the Wars, from photos to personal items. These were of great interest and widely viewed after the service.

The Rev. June Ladner conducted the service asking the question, "Why do we have wars?"

A poem by the late Mrs Shirley Rose about the Anzac Memorial in Canberra was recited by Mrs Brenda Talbot.

The Last Post was played on the cornet by Mr Brian Mundy and the Ode was recited by Mr Alan Halliwell.

Mr and Mrs Ron Talbot organized this Anzac event and thanked everyone for their help and the items, said they would most certainly like to do the same next year.

### Telephone Scam: Overseas & Premium Numbers

The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (ACCC) reports Scamwatch has found that Australians lost \$48,830 to premium service scams in the past 12 months.

#### How it works

Scammers made their money by enticing people to call back a premium number similar to those used by psychic hotlines and sex lines. The scam is known as a *wangiri* scam, a Japanese word loosely translated to *one cut*.

The scammer calls for just one ring then cuts the line leaving a missed call on the victim's phone. When the victim calls the number back they could be put on hold, have music playing or try and chat—as they want the caller to stay on line as long as possible, thereby increasing the amount of money they make, as the money makes its way

back to the scammer.

The ACCC says if you call your mobile provider and tell them what's happened, you won't end up having to pay the charge.

#### What can you do

To avoid extra charges on your phone bill, ignore calls from country codes you don't recognise and from 19 or 1900 numbers.

Blocking problematic phone numbers and not returning missed calls from unknown numbers can help avoid becoming a victim.

#### The best thing you can do to protect yourself during such a call is HANG UP.

#### Vicious Cycle

Victims were targeted because they had offered their information freely while signing up for apps or entering contests. The information is collated and sold off.

Once a victim returns a scam call scammers sell contact details to other fraudsters for people who they think might be susceptible to scams.

March and April. We have begun planting seedlings in fewer areas, using different techniques, in the hope that more seedlings will survive this year.

*Bush for Life* ran an interesting workshop on bush regeneration and visited the Park for the field work section . They were impressed by the changes to the park and praised our work, offering some useful suggestions for us to try.

Our monthly walks have usually been well supported. Our next one will be on Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> June and all community members are welcome to come along for a stroll at the new start time of 10am.

The friends have changed their working bees to Monday afternoons to enable a senior school student to join in each week. We're still getting lots done each afternoon, and also have time for a coffee and a chat after our work for the day is complete.
