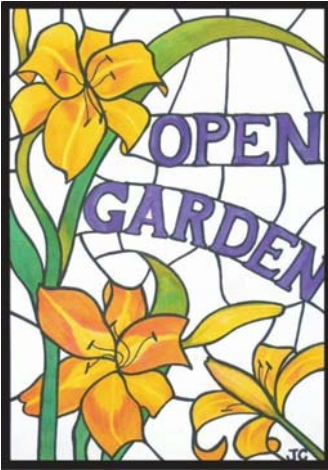

Moonta and District Progress Association - Annual Report 2019 /20 From the President, Graham Sobey

Progress had a busy and productive year, despite the go-slow created by the Covid 19 pandemic in its last quarter. The April committee meeting was cancelled and the June General Meeting was shifted to August. At our meetings we reviewed and planned for events, projects and finances. Progress donated \$200 to Moonta Community School for their annual prize giving and provided financial support for many programs, as mentioned below.

At the suggestion of Statewide Theatre we made an advertisement about what Progress does. The theatre kindly ran the advertisement as a contribution to the community. The community is looking forward to the theatre running again in Moonta, once the Town Hall repairs are completed.

Progress facilitated Copper Coast Council's consultations about Moonta Master Plan for the CBD, and Bay Road Development. Both topics created much discussion and varying opinions. Two committee members represented us at Master Plan consultation meetings.

Promoting the Past members have taken an active part in planning for the Sir Richard Williams Memorial celebrations. Progress's main roles will be to hold funds for the project and organise a parade in August next year.

The Town Beautification crew worked most Thursdays, keeping the town looking cared for. The crew tidied at the cemetery, Cross Roads Church, in Victoria Park and in McCauley Park. They teamed up with Lions to refresh garden beds at Polgreen Park and along Francis Terrace.

After some initial work in the McCauley Park area the Town Beautification crew and other Progress members began negotiations with Copper Coast Council to create a long term plan to develop the ponds and park.

A donation box was put in place at Splash Town and money raised will contribute to the development of the McCauley Park.

Four quarterly editions of the Community News were produced and distributed around Moonta and Port Hughes. Several people have shared the work of locating articles, publishing and distributing the latest editions. Included in the paper are a list of local businesses, and advertisements for which companies pay an annual fee. Covid 19 has affected most businesses so Progress decided to not charge the annual fee this year.

Insurance is our major expense because of the number of events and activities we undertake, and these costs are usually covered through business's advertising fees. This year the advertising is free and Progress used other funds to cover the insurance.

We have benefitted from one of our members' impressive IT skills. Improvements to our upgraded website, *What's On Moonta* have been completed. We also have a facebook presence which has a good following.

Moonta Business and Traders meet about every two months, on a needs basis. The group surveyed businesses about the Moonta master Plan, and provided feedback from the surveys to CCC. They also met with the Regional Development Australia who offered to assist traders to understand Covid 19 requirement and grants. Most businesses were required to close during the Covid lockdown and whilst some businesses are recovering, some main street businesses have ceased trading.

Christmas is celebrated with style in Moonta thanks to the events arranged by Progress. This year's activities were of the usual high quality. The pageant, with over forty floats, was well received by the large crowd. Most people went on to enjoy the markets, Carols by Candlelight and concert. Santa's Cave was well supported for the seven mornings it was open, despite the extremely hot weather. It was agreed to donate the \$1540 raised at the Santa's Cave to the Parndana Calisthenics Club which had been severely hit by the bushfires on Kangaroo Island.

George St was decorated with new garlands that Progress had purchased, having been partly funded with a grant from Copper Coast Council. The sound system in George Street will be upgraded ready this year's Christmas celebrations and the Kernewek Lowender in May 2021.

Our annual Show'n'Shine was again a great success, having been held the weekend before the Covid19 pandemic changed everything. Over 1300 paying adults walked through the gates and 108 cars were on view resulting in a pleasant day and a profit of \$6,200. This means there are more than enough funds for this year's Christmas festivities in whatever form they take.

Friends of Victoria Park have continued to keep the park tidy and pleasant. They received a grant of \$1000 from Natural Resources to install four interpretive signs about the park's environment. Progress contributed funds for three additional signs about the park's history. Members wrote and designed the signs which are a valuable addition to the Park.

Community members have been working to reinstate the Open Gardens Festival on the Saturday and Sunday of upcoming October long weekend. It is being held as a Progress event and we encourage everyone to visit the 15 impressive gardens.

The Community Activity Centre has been going great guns, with a record membership of 35, and continues to meet on Tuesday and Wednesdays. The group have helped with many community projects, including floats for the Christmas pageant, new horse rails at the Moonta Cemetery, and various projects for local residents of Moonta. Progress has purchased a laptop computer, new printer, and a defibrillator for the centre. Three members completed test and tag courses, enabling the centre to test all of the electrical equipment. Lighting has also been improved with LED lights all the way through the shed. The CAC is in the process of sourcing new dust extractors and other electrical equipment ready for expansion into what was formerly the float shed.

For years Progress members, and the Community Activity Centre have been raising funds to build a new, large shed to house the floats that are modified and repaired for various community parades. Copper Coast Council made a substantial contribution of \$68,000 through the Federal Government's Drought Relief Program, enabling the shed to be constructed. Progress provided a further \$5,000 to complete the shed which was officially opened by Mayor Rosalyn Talbot on September 9th.

The Moonta and District Progress Association provided major contributions to our community through the willing work of hundreds of volunteers; builders, photographers, marshals, gardeners, musicians, writers, woodworkers, technicians and general dogs bodies. I am very grateful to the reliable and enthusiastic efforts of so many community members. Thank you to my committee who have worked so well together to coordinate our community events and projects.

McCauley Park Development

For some time a group of volunteers called Town Beautification Crew have been keen to get support to renovate the area known as McCauley Park. The park is a beautiful legacy left to the town by Horace McCauley, Apexians and friends. It consists of a park and three ponds, one large and two small that collect water from several drains emptying into it from various areas in and around Moonta. The ponds are surrounded by trees, scrub and walkways.

The Town Beautification group consists of a number of like-minded 'senior' gentlemen and for many years they alone have tried to maintain the area. However, the work needed at McCauley Park is heavy hard yakka. So --- a call went out to the Copper coast Council for help. After a couple of get-togethers, Tim Neumann (Director of Infrastructures) and Matthew Rose (Coordinator of Maintenance) have taken on the job of overseeing the supply of machinery, manpower and general supervision of the planning and work.

There are six stages to be worked on, four as a joint effort and two that council will tackle. Whatever it takes to complete stages 1 - 6 will be done by volunteers and council and will be appreciated by all who use the park.

Improving the park will not happen overnight, but if younger local volunteers take up the challenge of monitoring and maintaining the park and ponds it can be done. Community members and visitors will have an area to have picnics in, to play in, to catch yabbies, to enjoy the peace and beauty and listen to the birds. The McCauley Park team will keep everyone informed about progress in the park, and hopefully, the dates of working bees.

Go Local First Campaign

Mayor Roslyn Talbot is encouraging Copper Coast residents to show their support for small businesses in their local communities for a nationwide campaign. The "Go Local First" campaign, an initiative of the Council of Small Business Organisations Australia (COSBOA), will highlight the vital role of small businesses in our nation's economic recovery from COVID-19 and in keeping local communities thriving.

"Over the past month since the Go Local First Campaign was nationally launched, we've been working closely with Moonta Traders Group, Wallaroo Community Development Association and Kadina Hub to implement this campaign in their communities with their local businesses," Mayor Talbot said. "It's been great to see how they've embraced this campaign and shown great enthusiasm with creative ideas in how to promote the campaign."

The campaign will encourage Australians to choose local small businesses when they are purchasing products and services to help get the economy back on its feet. Small businesses account for just over one-third of Australia's GDP and an economic recovery will not be possible without small businesses trading and hiring people.

"Throughout this pandemic, small businesses have done it tough," Mayor Talbot said. "Now is the time to be out supporting the Copper Coast's local grocers, butchers, restaurants, cafes, accounting and legal firms, gardeners, tradespeople, and local food producers. "Our local small businesses need our loyal communities to back them now, by 'going local first' when they need to buy a product or service. "When you shop locally, your money stays in the community, meaning local jobs and local economies not just surviving, but helping them to thrive as we emerge from COVID-19. "Australia's 3.5 million small businesses are the heartbeat of local communities, when they thrive, communities thrive, and the national economy prospers."

Research commissioned by COSBOA shows Australians are spending more at local businesses since the COVID-19 lockdowns began earlier this year, but temporary and permanent closures are preventing them from doing more to support them. "Now is the time for locals to support locals and I know our businesses will show why they deserve the support," Mayor Talbot said. "Recovery doesn't happen in one week, it will take time for businesses to recover. "As we move forward, they will need your continued support as this needs to be a long-term initiative,"

The research finds Australians see broad economic improvements as the most important issues for the country, after managing the spread of the coronavirus. The Go Local First campaign will be rolled out on outdoor, radio, and digital advertising for another five months with a call to action to consumers to spend locally first. On the 29th August 2021 Moonta will be celebrating and commemorating the centenary of the formation of the Royal Australian Air Force and its founding father Sir Richard Williams.

Richard (Dicky) Williams was born in Moonta on the 3rd of August 1890, son of Cornish parents. He excelled at Moonta school and was offered a teaching position before working for Moonta Post Office. He then joined the South Australian Infantry Regiment in 1909 before being commissioned as a Lieutenant in the permanent force. In 1914 he was one of four trainees to complete the first military pilot's course in Australia graduating as Australia's first military-trained pilot.

tary-trained pilot.

He was awarded the distinguished service order in August 1917 for conspicuous gallantry when attacking the enemy force and rescuing a pilot behind enemy lines. By the end of the war he was the Australian Flying Corp's foremost operational commander.

Showing immense political acumen, he was instrumental in the formation of the RAAF in 1921 and its development between the wars. He also completed a pioneering flight to the South Pacific in 1926. Appointed the first Chief of Air Staff of the RAAF, he served in the position three different times rising to the rank of Air Marshal. He served in World War II in various staff positions across the globe.

After leaving the RAAF, he led the Department of Civil Aviation and was knighted in 1954 before dying in 1980. He was accorded an air force funeral with a flypast of seventeen aircraft. To this day he is regarded as the 'father' of the RAAF and the most significant figure in the history of the RAAF. In 2005 Sir Richard's air wings, usually on display at Point Cook, were carried into space by South Australian astronaut Andy Williams.

Moonta's celebrations of Sir Richard's achievements and the RAAF will include a commemorative church service at Moonta Mines Church, a street parade and an unveiling and dedication of a plaque and statue of Sir Richard, with a flypast of RAAF aircraft. A day to Remember!

To accompany these celebrations Moonta Gallery of the Arts will be holding an exhibition of art and artefacts pertaining to the life and times of Sir Richard, the RAAF and flight. To this end the gallery is inviting artists to submit works, and community members to loan artefacts for the exhibition which will be held in July and August 2021.

Interpretive Signs



Walking through Victoria Park can be a very informative time with interpretive signs now dotted along the pathways, a project of the Friends of Victoria Park. Four of the signs deal with environmental type topics including rare plants, environmental weeds, the fauna in the park and revegetating the park. Historical topics such as the changing landscape, the famous rotunda and walking trails are explained on the three other boards.

Collecting information and pictures, writing the text and checking the signs were very time consuming tasks, as was the designing of each sign. The procedure involved many interested and knowledgeable people and all took countless volunteer hours. Each sign has a QR link to a website with additional information about the topic. The webpages linked via the QR patch are still works-in-progress, something that will keep the writers busy for a while.

A grant through Natural Resources and funding from Moonta and District Progress Association meant the Friends group could employ a local sign writer to print and install the signs. What a good job he did. A couple of weeks ago the signs were unveiled by Graham Sobey, President of MDPA and Janet Moore, Ranger representing Landscapes SA. The contribution of those who helped with the project were gratefully acknowledged.

The Friends of Victoria Park invite you to take your children or grandchildren for a walk in the park, and help them gain other perspectives of this fascinating patch of scrub.

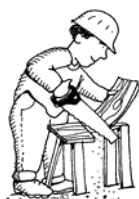
